Calvary Academy is a school dedicated to the glory of God. It is in existence to help you to grow spiritually, emotionally, physically, and academically. We believe that the biblical writer was correct when he said, "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom." So that we can all live together in harmony and united purpose, there are basic things about Calvary Academy that you need to know and understand.

In a very brief manner, let's look at some of the stated purposes of Calvary Academy.

1. To teach that God is the creator and sustainer of the universe, and that the Lord Jesus Christ is the Divine Son of God who came to earth to die for your sin.
2. To teach that God has spoken to us through the Bible, the only infallible Word of God, and to teach you how to study it, understand it, and apply its principles to every part of your daily life.
3. To inspire and motivate you toward a total personal commitment to Jesus Christ, so that you might live by and believe personally His Good News, allowing Him to change you and shape you in the midst of a world that knows only bad news.
4. To help you understand better, belong to, worship and serve in His church.
5. To help you love, obey, respect and help others as God desires, to look at life from His point-of-view.
6. To develop within you the ability to assume responsibility for the tasks that have been given you, and to be responsible in the way you behave and treat others.
7. To develop your mental abilities, for they are given to you by God, so that you may take your place in society as a mature, competent, alert, and well-trained person.
8. To help you grow as a thankful and responsible citizen of the country in which God has placed you, to understand our American heritage in order that you may better understand and appreciate the other cultures and peoples of the world.

These are but a few of our hopes and expectations for you. We trust that you will take every opportunity to open yourself up to the education offered at Calvary Academy, and to live here as a responsible member of the school community. It is expected that you will, at all times, live in accordance with what our school represents and believes; that in all things you will represent it well as an example of how a Christian student lives.

As a member of Calvary Academy, you will be expected to exert a positive influence in your social relationships and to be a responsible member of the Calvary Academy community.
